Naryn State University named after S.Naamatov

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The Naryn State University is one of the youngest universities in the Kyrgyz Republic. Established on the 22nd of May, 1996, by the decree of the President of Kyrgyzstan, the university now has more than 3000 registered students studying within its four departments, where more than 150 teachers are employed.

The rector of NSU is Prof. Dr. Kaldybaev Salidin Kadyrkulovich, since March 2010.

The mission of NSU is the preparation, through higher education, of skilled experts in the natural sciences and the humanities, as well as in pedagogy, law, informatics economy, and agriculture.

Department for Agrarian technology:

- 40 Teachers and 7 Doctoral candidates

This department focuses on realizing Naryn Oblast's potential by training specialists in Agricultural Production, Environmental Protection, Civil Engineering, Electric Engineering and New Information Technologies.

Department for Pedagogic:

Dean – Munaitpasova G., Ph.D.

- 40 Teachers, 3 Doctors of Science, and 12 Doctoral candidates

This department trains students in Mathematics, Computer Science, Political Science, Humanitarian Science and Pedagogical technology.

Department for Economics, Business and Administration

Dean – Nuralieva N., Ph.D.

- 45 Teachers, 2 Doctors of Science, and 9 Doctoral candidates

This department trains students in Economics, Finance and Credit, Accounting and Business Management, Mathematics, Computer Science and Political Science.

Department for Languages:

Dean - Chorobaeva N., Ph.D

- 35 Teachers, 2 Doctors of Science, and 6 Doctoral candidates

Kyrgyz, Russian, and English languages as well as classic world literature, teaching methods, and culture are taught in this department.

NSU also has sub-branches: the Naryn Agro economical College and the Naryn Pedagogical College. In addition, students benefit from the university's Korean Centre, Arabic Centre, Turkish Centre, American Centre, German and Chinese Centre.

The university implemented an effective model of modern education: NSU is one of the first universities of the country which transferred into multilevel system of education and introduced module system of learning, integrated international education projects and training programs and gain access to informational, educational and scientific resources.

For lectures and seminars, NSU faculty members actively engage students through advanced teaching techniques and the use of computer technology and audio-video equipment.

The NSU is actively worked in implementation of principles of the Bologna Declaration. More and more students are educated in credit-hours. There are efforts to improve the mobility of students and teachers.

In 2007, NSU became a partner-member of the European project Erasmus-Mundus TEMPUS. As part of this project about 20 students and teachers from NSU have been sent to European universities. NSU turn hosted the professors and graduates from Poland, Latvia and the Czech Republic.

In order to increase contact with European universities and to integrate the European education system into NSU, we believe it is necessary to create a close cooperation with European universities.

Project title: Modernisation of university educational system

Main activities:

1. Developing of exchange programs where teachers from Naryn State University will use the opportunity to acquire knowledge in their field and improve their teaching methods. Naryn State University will create selection criteria to make sure that they are sending teachers and professionals who are most likely to benefit from their experience.
2. Inviting professors from European universities to Naryn State University to have a better chance to study Kyrgyzstan and to provide high quality instruction to Naryn State University Students. To prepare for this, Naryn State University will identify appropriate areas for teaching, where students have the need and desire to learn from the visiting professors. Additionally, Naryn State University would develop appropriate living and support system for these professors.
3. Inviting students from European universities to study at Naryn State University. For this, Naryn State University would identify degree fields that are appropriate and accessible for foreign students and improve international student services. These students would offer cultural exchange and an improved level of scholarship at the university.
4. Develop a Master's and Doctorate programs that allows graduate students to be prepared for competitive, modern world. This includes a high level of technological instructional material (computers, projects, whiteboards and textbooks) and the highest level of instruction, meaning the best instructors who have demonstrated their quality in their field (e.g. PhD, published articles and books, and prior academic experience).
